Entrance Antiphon:

Save us, O Lord our God and gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name, and make it our glory to praise you.

First Reading: A reading from the prophet Jeremiah (1:4-5, 17-19)

In the days of Josiah, the word of the Lord was addressed to me, saying, 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you came to birth I consecrated you; I have appointed you as prophet to the nations. So now brace yourself for action. Stand up and tell them all I command you. Do not be dismayed at their presence, or in their presence I will make you dismayed. I, for my part, today will make you into a fortified city, a pillar of iron, and a wall of bronze to confront all this land: the kings of Judah, its princes, its priests and the country people. They will fight against you but shall not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you – it is the Lord who speaks.'

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps.18) R. I will sing of your salvation

- In you, O Lord, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame. In your justice rescue me, free me: pay heed to me and save me. (R)
- Be a rock where I can take refuge, a mighty stronghold to save me; for you are my rock, my stronghold. Free me from the hand of the wicked . (R)
- It is you O Lord, who are my hope, my trust O Lord, since my youth. On you I have leaned from my birth, from my mother's womb you have been my help. (R)
- My lips will tell of your justice and day by day of your help. O God, you have taught me from my youth and I will proclaim your wonders still (R)

Second Reading: A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians ((12:31 - 13:13)

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offense, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The Lord sent me to bring Good News to the poor, and freedom to prisoners. Alleluia!

Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (4:21-30)

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips. They said, 'This is Joseph's son, surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, 'Physician, heal yourself' and tell me, 'We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside.' 'And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country. 'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any of these: he was sent to a widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. 'And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these were cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.' When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.

Pastoral Corner

Rejection is not a nice feeling. And sadly, most of us will experience it at some time in our lives. Losing a job we love, losing a relationship or friend, being left out of a group... all these situations can make us sad and lonely and in extreme cases, inflict powerful and lasting emotional damage. But while rejection may be an unavoidable in life, it is also an experience that can make us stronger, wiser and tougher if only we allow it to. In today's Gospel, Jesus is driven out of town - rejected by the very people who were listening so intently to his word just moments earlier. This episode marks the first of many rejections experienced by Jesus; the final rejection of course, leading to his death on the cross. But the cross is not the end of Jesus' story, nor is his rejection in today's Gospel. Jesus simply slips away and continues on the path He has chosen. As difficult as it may feel when we are rejected in life, how liberating would it be to simply "slip away" from the hurt and continue on the path God has chosen for us...?


