3 May 2020 4th Sunday of Easter Year A

Entrance Antiphon: The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

First Reading: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2:14, 36-41)

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the eleven and addressed the crowd in a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.' Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, "What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent, 'Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation'. They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps. 22)

R. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

- The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit. (R.)
- He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort. (R.)
- You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing. (R.)
- Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. (R.)

Second Reading: A reading from the first letter of St Peter (2:20-25)

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty. This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you

and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults;

when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

Gospel: A reading from the Gospel According to John (10:1-10)

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. 'The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. 'When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him; they do not recognize the voice of strangers.' Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe; he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy, I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'

Memorial Acclamation: When we eat this bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

Communion Antiphon: The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.

Below is an extract from that book: A Prayer for our Lady's intercession especially in this month of May, the month of Mary.


Prayer for Liberation from the Pandemic to Our Lady of Divine Love

A Reflection on the 4th Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday)

I will give you shepherds after my own heart, to feed you with knowledge and understanding.

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter we hear about sheep and shepherds. At a time when we have been confined to our homes and physically disconnected from the rest of our community and our "shepherds" we may feel right now like sheep without a shepherd. "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." (Matthew 9:36)

Nowadays we often lock our doors more than we used to do in the past and now even our church doors are locked as part of our nation's concerted effort to keep us safe and secure. But Jesus who is the gate through which we enter into the kingdom challenges us most of all to keep the doors of our own hearts open so that he may enter in and lead us out of ourselves towards those restful waters that we thirst for.

The French translation of Psalm 22(23) resonates with me in a deeper way: "Tu es mon Berger, O Seigneur, rien ne saurait manquer ou tu me conduis." And it goes like this: "You are my Shepherd, O lord; where you desire to lead me, I shall lack nothing." (Psalm 23:1)

The image of the shepherd is also used to describe the role and mission of kings, Priests, teachers, parents and all those within our community who assume a leader-ship and guiding role. They are also called to model their style of leadership on that of Jesus the Good shepherd who is also the lamb of sacrifice, the suffering servant. With the vocation to lead and shepherd others comes suffering and self-sacrifice. The choices and decisions that need to be made for the good of others sometimes may go against the grain of popular expectations. In his First Letter St Peter reminds us that Jesus never lied; he never retaliated to insults and never threatened even when he was being tortured. Sometimes the prudent shepherd needs to keep his sheep within the enclosure to protect them from wolves and predators and those alluring voices.

Such voices within our community and sometimes within our own inner circle can be very seductive and they may sound good and pious but they are misguided, misinformed and plainly misleading and harmful to our faith and our Christian values. Due to our lack of intimacy and knowledge of the Good Shepherd we allow ourselves to be deceived and be led down the garden path. Especially during this time of insecurity and confusion, more than ever, we need to be more guarded, more vigilant and more faithful. Our humility and sense of obedience are currently being sorely tested.

In this time of confinement and restlessness let us continue patiently and with humility, through constant prayer and penance to attune the ears of our hearts to the gentle voice of the Good Shepherd because we truly believe that where he desires to lead us, we shall lack nothing.




