15th Sunday

Entrance Antiphon: As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

First Reading: A reading from the Prophet Isaiah (55:10-11)

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps. 64)

R. The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

- You care for the earth, give it water, you fill it with riches. Your river in heaven brims over to provide its grain. (R)
- And thus you provide for the earth; you drench its furrows, you level it, soften it with showers, you bless its growth. (R)
- You crown the year with your goodness. Abundance flows in your steps, in the pastures of the wilderness it flows. (R)
- The hills are girded with joy, the meadows covered with flocks, the valleys are decked with wheat, they shout for joy, yes, they sing. (R)

Second Reading: A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans (8:18-23)

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his sons. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

<u>Gospel Acclamation</u>: Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel According to Matthew (13:1-23)

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables. He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!' Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled: You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me. 'But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy mean longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it. 'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart; this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it, he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'

Memorial Acclamation: Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

<u>Communion Antiphon</u>: The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her young; by your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise.

THE LIFEHOUSE

The Lifehouse is a Women's-only Drop-in Centre at 138 Bennett Street East Perth. It provides shower and Laundry facilities, a GP, craft activities and a Prayer Room.

What is the Lifehouse? Open from 10am-2pm on Fridays, the Lifehouse is a place where homeless women can find shelter, security, friendship and the pastoral and spiritual support to find "fullness of life". It also provides material assistance in the form of lunch and takeaway food and providing "care packs with toiletries and other personal items. There is a particular focus on supporting women who are homeless and pregnant.

Why does the Lifehouse exist? Among the homeless population, women are especially vulnerable. They are at a very high risk of experiencing verbal, physical and sexual abuse. There is a need for a women's-only space where women living on the street can feel safe and cared for and which focuses on meeting their particular needs.

Who runs the Lifehouse? The Lifehouse is a collaborative project between the Right to Life Association of WA and the Holy Spirit Choir and Street Ministry.

If you would like to volunteer at the Lifehouse (women only) even for a couple of hours once a month, please contact Rebecca Kobayashi on 0432 980 608 or may be you would like to provide basic pantry food (pasta, rice, etc.) or toiletries or non-perishable food.


