Entrance Antiphon: God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people.

<u>First Reading</u>: A reading from the second book of the Kings (4:42-44)

A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing Elisha, the man of God, bread from the first fruits, twenty barley loaves and fresh grain in the ear. 'Give it to the people to eat,' Elisha said. But his servant replied, 'How can I serve this to a hundred men?' 'Give it to the people to eat' he insisted, 'for the Lord says this, "They will eat and have some left over." He served them; they ate and had some left over, as the Lord had said .

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps. 144)

R. The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers al our needs.

- All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord, and your friends shall repeat their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of your reign and declare your might, O God (R)
- The eyes of all creatures look to you and you give them their food in due time. You open wide your hand, grant the desires of all who live (R)
- The Lord is just in all his ways and loving in all his deeds. He is close to all who call him, who call on him from their hearts (R)

<u>Second Reading</u>: A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians (4:1-6)

I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope, when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is Father of all, through all and within all .

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people. Alleluia!

<u>Gospel</u>: A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (6:1-15)

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples, It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of the disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

Memorial Acclamation: Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

Communion Antiphon: Bless the Lord, O my soul, and never forget all his benefits.

PASTORAL CORNER


God provides the basic needs of human life. In today's readings these needs are supplied in the form of food – an essential ingredient for human survival. What we and the disciples of Jesus at that time need to learn, is that Jesus is not only resourceful he is himself the resource. The lesson is that God is the source of all and will supply all we require, God provides. Even in times and places where it doesn't seem possible, God provides. God provides for the needy abundantly, even to the point of over-abundance. The lesson is summed up in the response to the Psalm, "The hand of God feeds us; he answers all our needs".

Jesus feeds the people but the people are still hungry and follow him then for the other 'food' he has to offer them. We see Jesus' power over nature in today's reading when he multiplies loaves and fishes. We remember how he once walked on water and how he calmed the storm. Even today these deeds make us cry out in wonder and awe.

POPE FRANCIS ESTABLISHES WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY



Pope Francis has decided to institute a Church-wide celebration of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

Starting this year, it will be held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

The Holy Father said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while "young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

FUND-RAISING EVENT AT ST EMILIE'S




