Entrance Antiphon

Save us, O Lord our God! and gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name, and make it our glory to praise you.

1st Reading

Deuteronomy (18:15-20)

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die", and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

2nd Reading

The First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (7:32-35)

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Gospel

Mark (1:21-28)

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people was so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside. .



Pastoral Corner

In an age where self-fulfilment, self-motivation, self-assertiveness, self-development are all catch-cries, as Christians we are called upon to base out lives on a far greater authority than simply our own self-made wisdom and leadership. It is from God and God alone that our lives take their direction.

Today's first reading describes this authority as the word and laws of God passed down through the prophets. In the Gospel it is seen as the authority given to Jesus over sin and evil. Mark reveals to us the enormous impression that Jesus made on the everyday lives of the people. Against the background of the ordinary routine Sabbath day temple activities someone possessed by "an evil spirit" began shouting at Jesus accusing him and calling him "God's Holy One" and we know the rest of the story. What a shock to the lives of the complacent, the ordinary: here was someone said to be from God who spoke with amazing authority and had power over evil spirits. Isn't it the same news that we have, through our baptism, been commissioned to spread?

Reflect on how you are going about it, and is it as vital and life changing now as it was then?

2024 RE Program & Sacramental Program

2024 RE Program Enrolment Opportunities

The RE Classes covering Formation and Sacramental Preparation for Parish Children attending Government Schools will resume on Tuesday, 6th February 2024. If you haven't enrolled your children yet, we will be taking enrolments in the church foyer: Tuesday, 30th January & Thursday, 1st February from 2pm - 5pm. Fees are \$25 per child or \$35 for two or more children, with an additional fee for Sacraments. Cash or cheque only. For new enrolments we require a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate.

Sacramental Enrolments & Commitment Masses

A reminder to all Parish parents, who have children making either the Sacrament of 1st Reconciliation, 1st Holy Communion or Confirmation this year: You are required to fill out a Parish Sacramental Enrolment Form for your child and these are now available in the church foyer for you to enrol your child. This applies to children at St Emilie's Primary School and children attending the Parish RE Program After School Classes.

Commitment Masses for 2024 Sacramental Program

Children making a Sacrament are also encouraged to attend a Sacramental Commitment Mass and completed Sacramental forms can be returned at these Masses. The Mass dates are as follows:

- Sat 3rd Feb at 6pm Mass & Sun 4th Feb at 7.30am, 9.30am & 5pm Masses
 (Please note this is the weekend of the 1st week of Term 1)
- Sat 10th Feb at 6pm Mass & Sun 11th Feb at 7.30am, 9.30am & 5pm Masses

No need to book these Masses, just choose one to come to, and when you arrive someone from the Sacramental Team will meet you in the foyer of the church and register your child's attendance.
