




John 10:11-18

DEFBIBRILLATOR

St. Emilie's school has recently installed a defibrillator on the wall near the administration office, which is accessible around the clock. The school has very kindly extended the use of the defibrillator to the parish community if ever needed. A defibrillator is a life-saving device, which is easy to use by following the step-by-step prompts. We encourage you to take time to familiarize yourself with what is a defibrillator, how & when it is to be used. Please see poster on the notice board with more information.

What is a defibrillator? A defibrillator is a device that uses electricity to re-start the heart or shock it back into a normal rhythm. The defibrillator checks the person's heart rhythm to decide whether an electric shock is needed.

<u>When would I need to use a defibrillator?</u> Defibrillators are used when someone has a **cardiac arrest**. This is when the heart suddenly stops pumping properly. Defibrillators should be used alongside <u>cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)</u>. A cardiac arrest is not the same as a <u>heart attack</u>, but both are emergencies. Signs that someone is having a cardiac arrest include: **Collapse / loss of consciousness/ abnormal breathing or not breathing at all/ no pulse**. Giving the person CPR and using an AED as soon as possible can greatly increase the chances of survival. The most important thing is to use the AED quickly. Time is crucial. **If someone is showing signs of cardiac arrest**, **call an ambulance on triple zero (000)**. **Start CPR and use a defibrillator as soon as possible**.

How do I use an automated external defibrillator (AED)? Anyone can use an AED. AEDs must be used along with CPR. The device will verbally tell you what to do. It will usually come with visual prompts too.
