1st Reading **Deuteronomy 6:2-6**

Moses said to the people:

'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson.

Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength.

Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.

2nd Reading **Hebrews 7:23-28**

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood.

It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself.

The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?

The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.'

The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is on e and there is no other.

To love with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.

Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.'

And after that no one dared to question him any more. '



The message in this week's Gospel, tells us, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart and with your whole mind, with your whole soul and with all your strength". What does this sentence tell us about ourselves and our God? What does this phrase tell us about the relationship we have with God, what does it tell us about God's relationship with us? It tells us who we are, where we came from, where we are going and how we are going to get there. All the law and every idea anyone ever had are summed up in this one relationship. Our duty is to live it out. The psalm sums up our response to the Good News of God's love for us and our recognition that we must love God and our neighbour before all else, it is a song of love and praise to God, a personal God, a God who is close at hand:! love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour. My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold.

The Lord is worthy of all praise: It is love that describes our response to the Lord and to each other because somehow, they are mixed together in the curious chemistry that we are. Take time this week to reflect on this wonderful message.

To Rise With Christ: Guidance on burials and conserving ashes in the case of cremation (Holy See – 2016)

During this month of November, as we pray for our deceased loved ones, I would like to draw your attention to this very important Church Document that was published by the Holy See on 15 August 2016 to guide all Catholics on the sensitive issue of Christian burials and the conservation of ashes. It provides details about the doctrinal and pastoral reasons for choosing a burial. It also explains what is appropriate when conserving ashes in the case of cremation. St Emilie's Parish R.E. Program Re-enrolments and New Enrolments for 2025 during November.

Getting everyone re-enrolled for RE classes the following year is always a bit hectic, so to help we are going to start taking enrolments for 2025 on Tuesday's 5th, 12th and 19th November during class time 4pm – 5pm. So, just pop in when you drop off or pick up your children and get in early for 2025. Even if your child has been enrolled for 2024, you are required to re-enrol them again for the next year.

Fees are \$25 per child or \$35 for two or more children, with an additional fee for Sacraments. Cash or cheque only. There will be other opportunities in January 2025 to come and enrol your children, and the dates will be advertised and emailed in due course.


